



Pastor's Corner

Under Construction

Under construction! That's the first thought that comes to mind with a trip to St. Paul's these days. Whether you first notice the large earth-movers doing their thing, or the big mound of red Virginia clay in the front yard, or the men working high up on the roof, all point immediately to a building under construction. And "Hooray!" we say. Many of us have been waiting a long time for these changes to take place, and all of us are excited about the new opportunities they will give.

Under construction! Perhaps we should grab that image and wring some more out of it while the work is being done. Is it not "construction" that goes on at the church at all times? Is it not God who builds here—working on individuals and community? St. Paul explained this work to the Church of Ephesus in this way: "And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ" (Ephesians 4:11–13).

It's encouraging to know that God is building up individuals and the church. We love to see progress, we

look forward to good results and we're excited about the ability to do more. As much as God teaches us to be satisfied and content with the life he has given, he also works to bring improvement. God is the builder, and we're involved in the work too. What joy this brings!

If we remember that others are still under construction—still growing in maturity and being formed by God—then we will more easily forgive their sins and errors. But let's not forget the blessed end, too. Again, from St. Paul: "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6 ESV).


In the beginning ...

What you do:

- Brainstorm questions to ask one or more of your grandparents (topics can include their childhoods, favorites and advice).
 Write one question on each index card.
- Ask your grandparent to write his or her answers on the blank sides of the cards.
- 3. Make a cover by decorating one index card.
- 4. Punch a hole in the top left corner of each card.
- 5. Use a binder ring or string yarn through the holes and tie to secure the cards together.




Sometimes we resist the light of Christ. But when his light touches us, we can then share it with others. Play this fun game on a summer night to remember how Christ's light shines in the world.
