

## Make a Palm Cross

Even though we can't be in church to celebrate Palm Sunday, you can still make your own "palm" crosses... but out of paper!!

- Take your strip of paper and fold the top third of the paper towards you, and this part will serve as the base of your cross. Flip the paper around so this shorter piece is in the back.
- Take the longer piece of paper and bend it to the right at a 90 degree angle. This piece should be bent near the top of the paper, near where the two pieces of wood would intersect on an actual cross.
- That piece serves as the right side of the cross, so determine how long you want the side to be, then fold the longer piece left over behind the cross.
- Do that same step on the left side, this time folding the paper in front. Both "arms" of the cross should be the same size.
- Now the long piece of paper that is left over should be at the center of the cross. Fold this piece at a 45 degree angle, or diagonally to the upper right. Then, fold it across the back of the cross, or in between the very top of the cross and the right "arm" of the cross.
- The longer piece of paper should be sticking out of the lower left quadrant of the cross. Fold this piece horizontally across the base of the cross, and it should now be in the back.
- Next, fold the longer piece diagonally upwards, so you create an "X" around the center of the cross.
- Take the point of the remaining paper and wrap it around the folded base of the cross. Do this as many times as you need to for the cross to be secure, and tuck the remaining bit into a fold of the cross.
